



NEED HELP PAYING FOR CHILD CARE?

YOU MAY QUALIFY FOR ASSISTANCE!

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Onondaga County's child care assistance program covers most (and sometimes all) of the cost of care. Families may qualify if they:

- ✓ Are working and they meet income eligibility guidelines (see chart at right)
- ✓ Are attending high school, a high school equivalency program (GED), a two- or four-year college degree program, or a training program
- ✓ Have an active Temporary Assistance case; are homeless; are receiving services for victims of domestic violence; have an open protective or preventative services case; are participating in a substance abuse treatment program; are enrolled in vocational, ESL, remedial, or literacy training; or are experiencing a short-term medical emergency
